Director of Public Health report predicts significant increases in health service demand



Milton Keynes' population has been growing much faster than the national average and this high growth rate is expected to continue, alongside an increasing proportion of older people and growing ethnic diversity.

This population change is projected to lead to large increases in the number of people with common health conditions by 2043 including:

- Approaching 55% increase in the number of people with hypertension
- Approaching 70% increase in the number of people with other cardiovascular conditions
- Approaching 60% increase in the number of people with musculoskeletal conditions
- Over 25% increases in the number of people with depression or anxiety

In turn, the increased number of people with health conditions is projected to generate:

- 37% (around 510,000) more primary care consultations per year
- 36% (around 215,000) additional outpatient attendances per year
- 32% (around 26,000) more visits to A&E per year
- 43% (around 16,000) more planned admissions per year
- 42% (around 13,000) more emergency admissions per year

The projections in this report build on the [population forecasts](#) featured in the last newsletter, which were locally developed to reflect local house building plans, as well as assumptions on rate of births, deaths and migration.

New PHOF Surveillance Dashboard analyses all 277 indicators in one place



The Public Health Outcomes Framework (PHOF) comprises a collection of public health-related indicators that combine to provide a comprehensive view of the health of a population and the impact of deprivation. It includes indicators reflecting:

- Overall outcomes, such as life expectancy and healthy life expectancy
- Healthcare and premature mortality, including disease prevalence and mortality
- Health protection, such as immunisation rates and health checks
- Health improvement indicators relating to healthy lifestyles
- Wider determinants of health, such as poverty, employment, education and environment

A new PHOF Surveillance Dashboard has been created, highlighting:

- Which indicators are underperforming locally compared to both the national average and other local authorities with similar levels of deprivation (the deprivation decile)
- Which indicators are trending negatively reflecting that the measure has got significantly worse over the previous five time periods
- Which local indicators are in the 10% worst performing nationally
- The status of all indicators compared to England and other local authorities with similar levels of deprivation

The Dashboard will be updated three times a year, in February, May and November, in line with the scheduled updates in Fingertips ensuring that the latest data is available.
