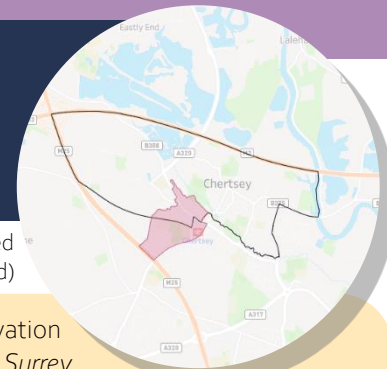
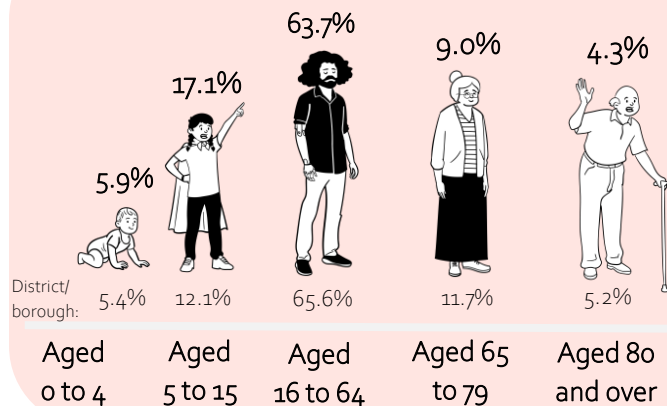


# 'Runnymede 006D' in Chertsey St. Ann's

1644 residents (2020)



5.3% receive jobseekers' allowance or universal credit (2.2% in D/B) (July 2022)

16.2% of all children are in absolute low income families (8.6% in D/B, 7.7% in Surrey, 15.4% in England) (2020/21)

35.6% of which are in lone parent families. 20.5% of which are in out of work families.

26.9% pensioners are in poverty (7.5% in D/B, 6.0% in Surrey) (February 2022)

Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD, 2019) ranks *within Surrey* (out of 709):

*1st = most deprived*

- 33rd Employment.

6.9% of residents do not have English as their main language

Made up of:  
5.9% speak English well  
1.0% do not speak English well or cannot speak English

13.0% of households were in fuel poverty in 2020, which is likely to have risen considerably (6.9% in D/B)

25.0% households not connected to the gas network (16.2% in D/B) (2020)

The 3 sectors with the most jobs in the area (2020):

- 48.0% in professional, scientific and technical,
- 28.0% in construction,
- 12.0% in education.

51.1% lower carbon footprint per person than the D/B average (36.4% lower than England)

30.0% of all adults have no qualifications (18.3% D/B), & 15.0% of those aged 16-24 (6.8% D/B). (2011 Census)

**Disability and long-term health conditions**

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) for 7.4% of residents aged 65 and under (Apr-22).

Attendance Allowance for 19.6% of over 65s (Feb-22).

**118.6 overall crime offences per 1,000 people** (91.7 in D/B, 74.3 in Surrey, 94.3 in England)

Per 1,000 (Jun-21 to May-22):

- 17.0 anti-social behaviour (19.3 in D/B)
- 13.5 burglary (9.3 in D/B)
- 46.8 violent crime and sexual offences (28.2 in D/B)
- 1.8 robbery (0.4 in D/B)
- 9.1 vehicle crime (6.2 in D/B)
- 13.4 criminal damage (8.4 in D/B)

**Estimated disease prevalence** (2019/20)

- 13.6% high blood pressure (12.7% D/B, 13.3% Surrey)
- 15.0% depression (11.1% D/B, 10.4% Surrey)
- 8.3% obesity (7.0% D/B, 7.4% Surrey)
- 7.2% diabetes (5.9% D/B, 5.8% Surrey)
- 5.3% asthma (5.2% D/B, 5.9% Surrey)
- 98.1% cancer - number of new cases as % of expected new cases - (100.0% D/B, 97.4% Surrey)
