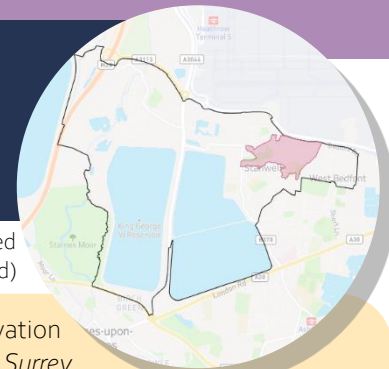
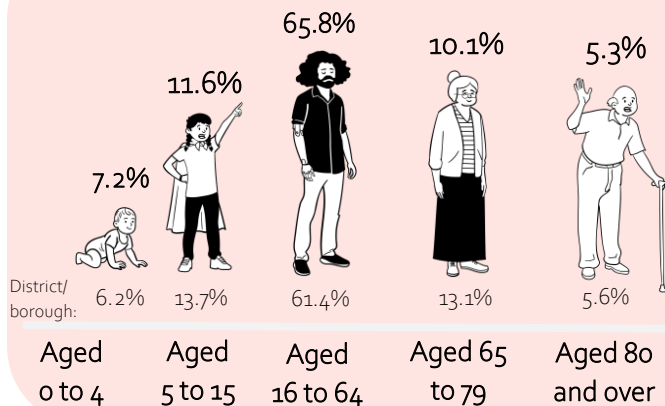


'Spelthorne 001B' in Stanwell North (1 of 2 LSOAs)

5.9% receive jobseekers' allowance or universal credit (3.0% in D/B) (July 2022)

14.8% of all children are in absolute low income families (9.4% in D/B, 7.7% in Surrey, 15.4% in England) (2020/21)

43.9% of which are in lone parent families. 12.3% of which are in out of work families.

9.7% pensioners are in poverty (7.4% in D/B, 6.0% in Surrey) (February 2022)

7.3% of households were in fuel poverty in 2020, which is likely to have risen considerably (6.9% in D/B)

42.7% households not connected to the gas network (11.5% in D/B) (2020)

(2021) 52.8% lower carbon footprint per person than the D/B average (35.6% lower than England)

137.2 overall crime offences per 1,000 people (96.5 in D/B, 74.3 in Surrey, 94.3 in England)

- 30.6 anti-social behaviour (20.6 in D/B)
- 12.8 burglary (8.9 in D/B)

The 3 sectors with the most jobs in the area (2020):

- 85.7% in transport and storage (inc postal),
- 7.1% in education,
- 7.1% in health.

24.9% of all adults have no qualifications (20.4% D/B) & 16.9% of those aged 16-24 (11.4% D/B). (2011 Census)

- 13.7% high blood pressure (14.8% D/B, 13.3% Surrey)
- 6.7% depression (10.3% D/B, 10.4% Surrey)
- 10.4% obesity (9.0% D/B, 7.4% Surrey)
- 8.4% diabetes (7.3% D/B, 5.8% Surrey)
- 5.2% asthma (5.5% D/B, 5.9% Surrey)
- 97.2% cancer - number of new cases as % of expected new cases - (101.9% D/B, 97.4% Surrey)
