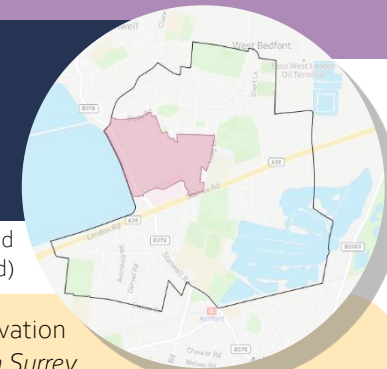
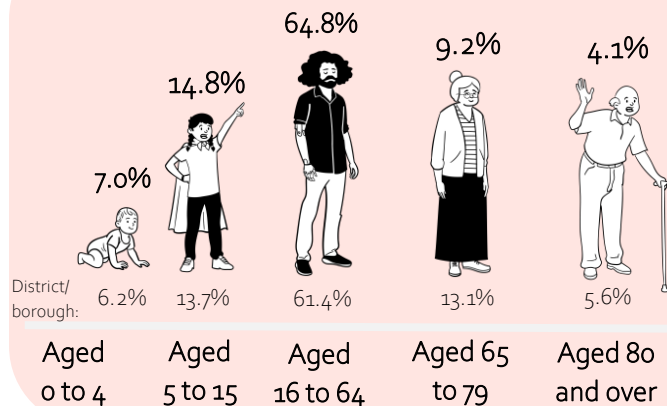


'Spelthorne 002C' in Ashford North and Stanwell South

1979 residents (2020)



5.8% receive jobseekers' allowance or universal credit (3.0% in D/B) (July 2022)

16.0% of all children are in absolute low income families (9.4% in D/B, 7.7% in Surrey, 15.4% in England) (2020/21)

53.6% of which are in lone parent families. 29.8% of which are in out of work families.

17.7% pensioners are in poverty (7.4% in D/B, 6.0% in Surrey) (February 2022)

11.1% of households were in fuel poverty in 2020, which is likely to have risen considerably (6.9% in D/B)

16.4% households not connected to the gas network (11.5% in D/B) (2020)

(2021) 33.9% lower carbon footprint per person than the D/B average (9.9% lower than England)

92.0 overall crime offences per 1,000 people (96.5 in D/B, 74.3 in Surrey, 94.3 in England)

Per 1,000 (Jun-21 to May-22):

- 13.1 anti-social behaviour (20.6 in D/B)
- 6.3 burglary (8.9 in D/B)
- 26.8 violent crime and sexual offences (29.3 in D/B)
- 0.5 robbery (0.5 in D/B)
- 15.7 vehicle crime (7.8 in D/B)
- 4.5 criminal damage (8.1 in D/B)

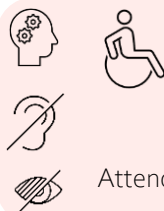

Disability and long-term health conditions

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) for 6.9% of residents aged 65 and under (Apr-22).

Attendance Allowance for 22.3% of over 65s (Feb-22).

The 3 sectors with the most jobs in the area (2020):
44.4% in retail,
16.7% in health,
2.2% in accommodation and food services (hospitality).

28.2% of all adults have no qualifications (20.4% D/B, & 23.1% of those aged 16-24 (11.4% D/B). (2011 Census)

Estimated disease prevalence (2019/20)

- 14.0% high blood pressure (14.8% D/B, 13.3% Surrey)
- 7.2% depression (10.3% D/B, 10.4% Surrey)
- 10.7% obesity (9.0% D/B, 7.4% Surrey)
- 8.5% diabetes (7.3% D/B, 5.8% Surrey)
- 5.3% asthma (5.5% D/B, 5.9% Surrey)
- 111.6% cancer - number of new cases as % of expected new cases - (101.9% D/B, 97.4% Surrey)
