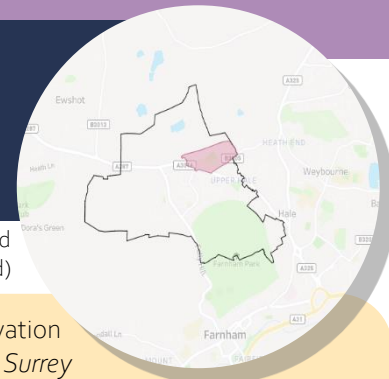
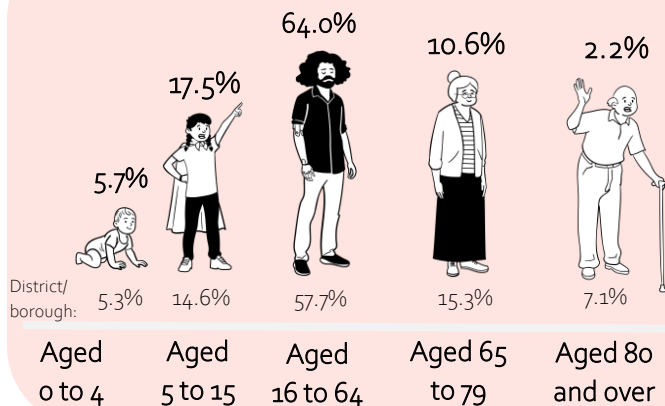


# 'Waverley 002E' in Farnham Upper Hale

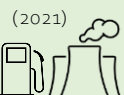

5.7% asthma (6.4% D/B, 5.9% Surrey)  
99.6% cancer - number of new cases as % of expected new cases - (93.3% D/B, 97.4% Surrey)
