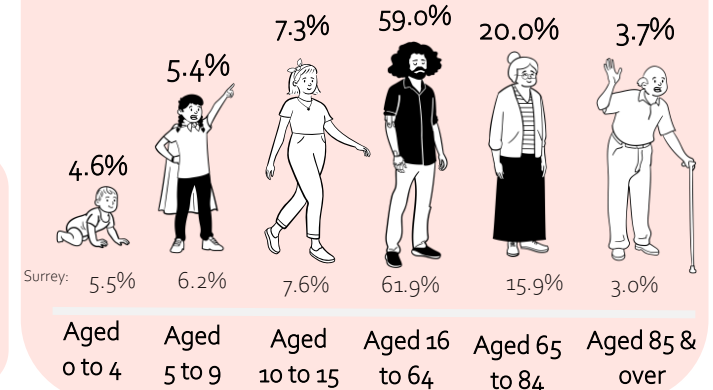

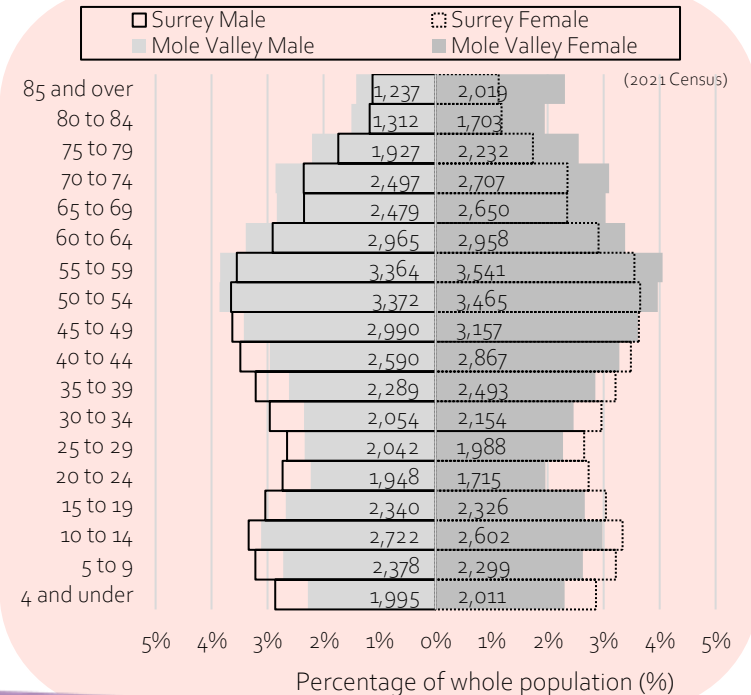

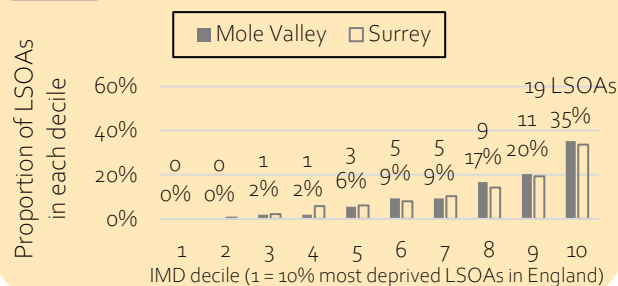

## Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD, 2019)



56.7% households were not classified as deprived in any dimension (employment, education, housing, or health) (57.1% in Surrey). (2021 Census)
