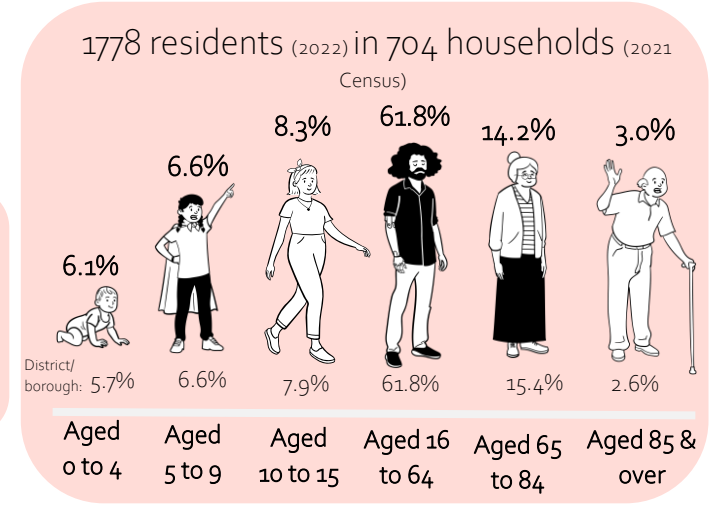

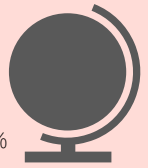

13.7% residents do not hold a passport (5.9% D/B, 7.6% Surrey, 13.2% England) (2021 Census)



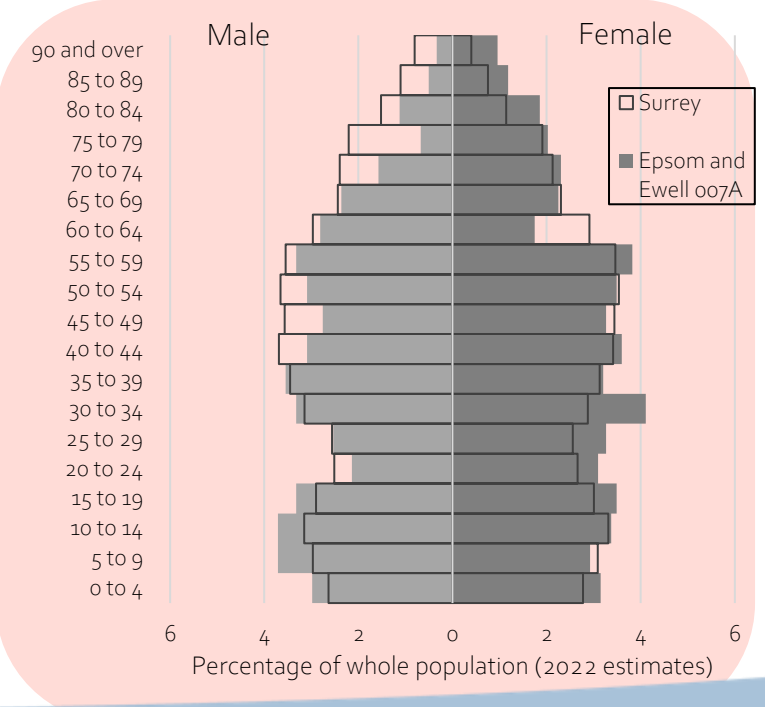

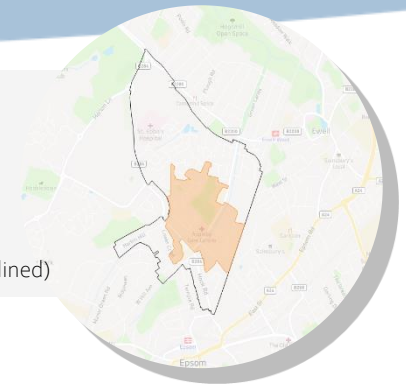
9.7% of residents provide unpaid care (7.9% D/B) (2021 Census)

14.4% of all children are in absolute low-income families (5.0% in D/B, 6.9% in Surrey, 15.6% in England)

52.9% of which are in lone parent families.  
27.9% of which are in out of work families. (2023)

Youth unemployment: 7.4% of 18-24s are in receipt of Universal Credit or Jobseeker's Allowance (3.0% in D/B, 2.70.0% Surrey)

Adult unemployment: 4.6% of all adults are in receipt of UC or JSA (2.0% in D/B, 2.2% Surrey) (May 2024)

23.3% pensioners are in poverty (6.0% in D/B, 6.1% in Surrey) (Nov 2023)

10.4% of households were in fuel poverty in 2022, which is likely to have risen considerably (8.0% in D/B)

1.4% of households are without central heating (1.0% D/B, 1.0% Surrey) (2021 Census)

62% lower carbon footprint per person than the D/B average (49% lower than England) (2021)
